The year's highlights:

- 1. Coming of Age Boys Weekend hosting a community dinner and facilitating the welcoming initiation on May 2-3.
- 2. Men's Retreat The retreat was held at Judson-Collins Center on Wamplers Lake on September 25-27, at Judson-Collins. Over 60 men attended.
- 3. Men's Circles Five active circles involve approximately 70 men. We are working with interested men to form a new circle.
- 4. Men's Dinner The 2015 Men's Dinner occurred on May 8, 2015 and featured Professor Woody Neighbors speaking on "Man Up, Man Down: What "Real Men" (should) do in Times of Trouble." Over 60 men attended. The 2016 Men's Dinner will occur on April 16 and will feature Domenic Tamborriello, who will speak on "Healthy Masculinity: Oxymoron or Hope for the Future?" This year's dinner is open to everyone and we expect a large turnout.
- 5. Monthly Breakfasts On the third Saturday each month at 8:30am, a mix of dozen men drop by to share stories and news of the day.
- 6. Church Property Activities The council is in conversation with the Accessibility Committee regarding some potential improvement projects.
