Description

Ann Arbor Unitarian Universalists for Justice in the Middle East (AA-UUJME) is one of 26 chapters across the county that are part of the 50-year-old <u>UUs for Justice in the Middle East</u> (UUJME) organization. We advocate for freedom, justice and equality for all people living in the Middle East with a particular focus on Palestine/Israel. Lasting peace requires an end to Israeli military rule, colonization and occupation of Palestinian territories; the right of refugees to return; and equal rights for Israel's Palestinian citizens.

Activities

- 2020 UUA General Assembly business resolution, <u>Embodying Human Rights in Our Investment Decisions</u>, sponsored by *Black Lives UU*, *UU Refugee and Immigrant Services and Education*, *UUs for Justice in the Middle East, UU Ministry for Earth and UU Peace Ministry Network* and developed in association with the *UUA Investment Committee* and the *UUA Socially Responsible Investing Committee*, was adopted by a vote of 95%.
- AA-UUJME enthusiastically supported the UUAA Board of Trustees decision to move our congregation's investments into the UUA Common Endowment Fund.
- We sent a letter sponsored by several social justice groups and signed by members of UUAA to Rev. Susan Frederick-Gray, UUA president, thanking her for signing <u>Churches</u> <u>for Middle East Peace</u> letters to <u>Congress</u> and <u>President Biden</u>.
- UUJME sponsored the *Voices from the Holy Land* film series showcasing independent films by Palestinian and Jewish film makers on the theme of Palestine/Israel.

Goals

A process to consider a congregational resolution supporting the global <u>Boycott</u>, <u>Divestment and Sanctions movement (BDS)</u> for Palestinian rights is being planned that will include opportunities to learn about BDS as a nonviolent strategy against oppression, engage in respectful discussion and provide input on the resolution's content.
