UUAA Sharing the Collection Program 2020-21

What We Do: The offering collected on the first Sunday Service of every month is donated to a non-profit community service organization in Washtenaw County which serves predominantly disadvantaged and vulnerable populations, such as low-income families and individuals, people who have been targets of discrimination or disabled or abused populations. The priority areas of UUAA Vision 20/50 (climate justice, anti-racism/anti oppression and radical welcome) also guide our mission.

The UUAA Sharing the Collection Team develops selection criteria for the program; publicizes and invites community service organizations to apply; develops and reviews the application to be used for the selection process; selects and notifies the monthly "collection" recipients; publicizes the program to the congregation through the UUAA website, the UUAA Newsletter, Weekly Bulletin, and Congregational Meeting reports. The Sharing the Collection Team works closely with the UUAA staff and reports to the Social Justice Council.
