UUCivs: Vote Your Values

People at our voting events tell us they are confused -- it's understandable. There are no certainties in voting this year. Folks are especially worried about navigating the online application process for an absentee ballot and getting their ballot to a drop box. You can help them, and we can help you.

Take a look at our <u>Voting Deadlines chart</u> and make your voting plan. Then, check-in with siblings, parents, grandparents, and first-time voters to help them with their plan. Make sure they have a blue or black pen, and watch for postage requirements. Tell them to ignore the USPS postcard they received, it's misleading.

It's Fall, and time for reminders. Many retailers participate in scrip programs that will benefit nonprofits (like UUAA),
