UUCivs: Vote Your Values

Early Voting by absentee ballot has begun!

October 3 is our recommended last date to APPLY BY MAIL for an absentee ballot. Ballot applications are also <u>available</u> online and at your <u>Clerk's office</u>.

Consult VOTE411.org for information about the candidates and proposals on your ballot.

Avoid common ballot errors: Use a blue or black pen to fill in the boxes on your ballot and sign the outside of the return envelope. Additional voting tips and deadlines are given on **UUCiv's webpage**.

Return completed ballots: By mail, in person at your clerk's office, or via drop box.

Poll workers are <u>needed in Detroit</u>. Republican-affiliated poll workers are needed in these <u>Washtenaw County</u> locations: Ann Arbor City and Township, Ypsilanti City and Township, Northfield Township, and Superior Township.
