I also wanted to let you know about some important ways that our relationship will be changing as I prepare to transition out of my current role and take up my place with the congregation in Connecticut. These are rooted in my commitment to the Unitarian

Universalist Ministers Association covenant and the healthy boundaries that undergird it.

- I've been honored by the trust that so many of you have placed in me when we've discussed something you were wrestling with. To remain worthy of such trust, I will redirect you to Rev. Manish, Rev. Cassi, and the UUAA Pastoral Care Team to help you with future struggles and explorations.
- There are few things more meaningful to me as a minister than officiating at memorial services and weddings. Going forward, I will need to grieve losses and celebrate new beginnings from afar.
- I love the way that social media keeps me connected with friends all over the world. As your outgoing minister, I will maintain an appropriate distance virtually as well as geographically.

Does this mean that you shouldn't even say hello if we run into each other at General Assembly or some other event? Actually, I'd love for you to say hi. People from this congregation will always hold a place in my heart. By releasing each other from the way things have been, though, we all make room for our next chapters to unfold — me in New Haven, you here in Ann Arbor — held always by a love that will not let us go.
