Opportunities abound to take part in the upcoming General Assemby (GA)! GA is the annual gathering of Unitarian Universalists from around the world.

For all other events at GA, registration is required. This year the registration fee is only \$150; it will never cost less than that! You can register using this <u>link</u>.

Registration gives you access to lots of workshops, featured



speakers, and the Ware Lecture (not listed in the free events).

Habitat for Humanity NEW PLAN, NEW HOUSES, NEW DATES

Habitat has regrouped to figure out how best to catch up on the homes that are behind schedule and how to integrate into that measures to keep volunteers as safe as possible.

- Crew sizes have changed. There will be fewer workers on site to help assure social distancing.
- In August and September, we will have two houses to work on:
 - The Good News house: 2754 Appleridge St., Ypsilanti
 - The Thrivent House: 1622 Wiard, Ypsilanti
- The revised schedule for UUAA is:
 - Saturday, July 25 (3 volunteers)
 - Saturday, August 15 (4 volunteers)
 - Saturday, August 29 (4 volunteers)
 - Saturday, September 19 (10 volunteers)

As part of the safety guidelines we will not be providing lunches to volunteers this year. Volunteers need to bring their own work



gloves, mask (you must wear a mask on site), lunch and water. You are welcome to bring your own tools if you would like. If you need help getting a mask or gloves, email habitat@uuaa.org.
