Dear friends:

Many of you may know that our congregation voted to ordain theresa rohlck into the Unitarian Universalist ministry at our January 2020 Congregational Meeting. That ordination was scheduled for June 6, 2020, however in conversation and collaboration with theresa, we are moving the Act of Ordination to **this Sunday, April 26, included in our regular 11:30am online Sunday service**, with an in-person celebration of the ordination subsequently in the next congregational year.

There are many reasons for this: it is unclear what the public health situation in the state of Michigan might be like in early June; we may not be able to gather, as a community, in person; if we are able to gather, it may be unclear what losses we may collectively need to hold and mourn, and a celebratory event might feel 'off'; and, perhaps most importantly, theresa requested that our community ordain her earlier, as in these pandemic times her ability to minister with the formal title of 'Reverend' is helpful to her pastoral work at St. Joseph's Hospital. As such, we invite you to join us this Sunday, April 26 at 11:30am online at www.uuaa.org/service for the opportunity to honor, bless, and officially ordain theresa rohlck into the Unitarian Universalist ministry!



Immigration Action Coalition (IAC) News

IAC has been active these past several weeks. Volunteers donated dozens of bars of soap to the Monroe County jail (200 men, 50 undocumented). We send a big thanks to Bill Lopez and UM School of

Public Health students for organizing this effort. IAC recently gave Washtenaw Interfaith Coalition for Immigrant Rights \$14,000 from UUAA Sanctuary funds to support undocumented immigrants in our community. WICIR has been able to deliver funding to 189 families at this time. IAC members are currently advocating (by mail and phone) for the release of persons held in ICE detention, especially due to health risks during Covid19.)
