Flower Communion is an annual Unitarian Universalist ritual that celebrates the uniqueness of the individual (a single flower) and the beauty of community (a

bouquet). All are invited to bring a flower to add to a communal vase, relish in the beauty of the gathered, and leave with a flower brought by another. Unitarian Universalists from around the world have celebrated Flower Communion since the 1920s and today, we continue the tradition virtually.


Black Congregants at UU + POC Gathering Zoom Meetup




Author Discussion of Separated Sunday, May 17, 6:00pm

Join us for a Zoom gathering with William Lopez to discuss his book Separated: Family and Community in the Aftermath of an Immigration Raid. There will be time for a Q & A following his presentation.

In Separated, Lopez examines the lasting damage done by this daylong act of collaborative immigration enforcement in Washtenaw County, Michigan in November, 2013. Exploring the chaos of enforcement through the lens of community health, Lopez discusses deportation's rippling negative effects on families, communities, and individuals. He details the incredible strain that immigration raids conducted by ICE and local law enforcement placed on one Latino community—and the families and friends left behind.
