# Author Discussion of Separated Sunday, May 17, 6:00pm

Join us for a Zoom gathering with William Lopez to discuss his book *Separated: Family and Community in the Aftermath of an Immigration Raid*. There will be time for a Q & A following his presentation.

In Separated, Lopez examines the lasting damage done by this daylong act of collaborative immigration enforcement in Washtenaw County, Michigan in November, 2013. Exploring the chaos of enforcement through the lens of community health, Lopez discusses deportation's rippling negative effects on families, communities, and individuals. He details the incredible strain that immigration raids conducted by ICE and local law enforcement placed on one Latino community—and the families and friends left behind.



### Scrip Program

The Scrip Program is <u>changing</u>. Names used for ScripNow, ReloadNow, and PrestoPay will be replaced with simpler descriptions: eGift cards, reloading gift cards instantly or overnight, and paying online with a bank account or credit card. Many of the 750+ retailers offer instant eGift cards for immediate purchase that can be used personally or sent as gifts by email. It will now be even easier to differentiate online between instant reloads and overnight reloads. A <u>reload products list</u> shows the difference. Questions?
