Mindful Eating Team – Food Gatherers Farm Project


We are done for the season! Despite the many challenges we faced in 2020, our ninth season

on the property of Farmer Bill Schmid was a huge success. Our social justice service project that fights hunger in Washtenaw County raised over 3,900 pounds of fresh produce and more than \$6,600 in sales at the honor-system roadside stand – all donated to Food Gatherers. This represents about 1,100 hours of work by our incredible team of volunteers, several of whom worked more than 50 hours this season. Our farm project builds bridges within the community and truly makes an impact on the lives of our neighbors who suffer food insecurity. We'll be back again next year for Season 10!

Washtenaw County has seen a dramatic uptick in the number of people seeking emergency food as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic. The Mindful Eating Team urges UUAA members to support organizations addressing this challenge.

Food Gatherers, our primary food rescue and distribution organization, announced two events to raise awareness and funds to meet the continuing need.


