Join Us on Sunday

Sunday, November 7, 9:30am and 11:30am

Join us this Sunday as we gather in person for two services at 9:30am and 11:30am, "We Remember Them." Through ritual, music, song, words, and silence we will honor, in this

annual Service of Remembrance, those from our beloved community who have died over the past two years. We will also collectively create a memory altar, connecting us to those who have gone before us. Please feel free to bring a photo or object to represent loved ones you have lost.

We will be sharing the collection this Sunday with IHN/Alpha House. IHN was established in 1992 to provide shelter and support to homeless and atrisk families. The group serves over 40 families a year—up to six at a time —in their shelter, Alpha House, and an additional 20 to 30 families in their home-based support program. IHN provides intensive support services to address each family's individual needs and barriers to securing permanent housing.

There will be a social hour after both services. We will be serving grab-andgo doughnuts at the main entrance for you to take with you as you leave UUAA on Sunday morning. With the onset of winter and the removal of the tents outside the Social Hall, we no longer have an outdoor space for gathering to eat. We will return to serving beverages once we can be inside unmasked safely.

We will also be livestreaming the service if you prefer to attend from home. You can join us at <u>uuaa.org/service</u>.

Please note that masks will be required for everyone over the age of 2.*

*Exception to the mask requirement: members of the worship team who are actively speaking can remove their masks. The first row of chairs in the sanctuary will be removed to ensure proper distancing.



The Return of the Social Hall Tables Sundays after each service starting November 14

Starting on Sunday, November 14 we will resume having congregational tables in the Social Hall after each service. We will still have UUAA fundraisers (i.e. the Scrip Program and Fair Trade Coffee Sales),

Updated COVID Precautions

It's been such a joy to gather in person and online these past two months. Countless community members - adults, children and youth - have commented that our shift into multi-modal gatherings has given them the support they

need during this continuing time of pandemic. We also continue to welcome new visitors each week who are looking for a spiritual home. Of course, we've only been able to gather again because of our community's commitment to health and safety. On that front we have cause for celebration: since the start of the pandemic through to today, there has not been a single known COVID case linked to participation or attendance at a UUAA event. That's amazing, and we thank you for your continued and deep commitment to our community's collective well-being! As we move now into the colder winter months and outdoor gatherings are no longer a reliable option, our COVID-19 Advisory Team has updated our <u>COVID</u> <u>Precautions Policy & Procedures</u> accordingly.

Highlights of our updated policy include:

- Universal masking indoors and outdoors will continue (with limited exceptions). This is in keeping with the latest science, which continues to show that masking is one of the most effective ways to prevent COVID.
- Our Social Hour will move indoors. No food or drinks will be served so that we can remain masked. However, individually packaged donuts will be available outside for community members to take as they leave.
- Social hall tables for groups, fundraisers, and events will return, but the number of tables will be limited to prevent crowding.
- SGD classes for children/youth will move indoors (although children/youth should still come prepared to go outside in case the weather allows). Like the public schools, we strongly encourage children/youth who are eligible to get vaccinated to do so and we require our staff and volunteer teachers to be vaccinated.
- We are increasing the number of singers that can perform in an ensemble from 5 to 10. We feel safe making this change because our masking policy combined with our required COVID antigen tests, prior to appearing before the community, have proven to be effective.
- We continue to strongly encourage all community members who are eligible to get vaccinated and we ask that everyone entering the building <u>complete the self-screening questionnaire</u>.

Please read the full text of our updated <u>COVID Precautions Policy &</u> <u>Procedures</u> carefully. If you have questions or feedback for the COVID-19 Advisory Team, please contact Executive Minister, Rev. Cassandra Hartley at <u>cassandra@uuaa.org</u>.

It's our intention to use this policy as our guide for November and December, and then reassess what adjustments may be warranted. Of course, if our local health circumstances change significantly, we may make adjustments sooner. As always, we encourage all our members and friends to determine for themselves what level of health and safety risk is appropriate for you and/or your family. We hope and trust that UUAA's multi-modal programming (which includes in-person, live-streaming, and 'on demand' modes of interaction) will continue to give the vast majority of our community meaningful ways to stay connected. Thank you for your continued support as we navigate the many different needs of a large, multigenerational community. May our time together continue to be a source of joy and renewal, especially as we move into the holiday season ahead.


Transgender Day of Remembrance Observance
