On Sunday, November 28, join us for two services at 9:30am and 11:30am, "Reflections on Gratitude and Thanksgiving." This Sunday we reflect on the themes of this holiday weekend, which include gratitude and thanksgiving. Members, friends, and visitors from near and far are warmly welcome as we join together in story, music, and reflection on these themes.

On Sunday, November 28, children and youth in K - 12 will meet together in the Fahs Chapel for multi-age programming during both services (nursery and preschool care will be available).

There will be a social hour after both services. We will be serving grab-andgo doughnuts at the main entrance for you to take with you as you leave UUAA on Sunday morning. With the onset of winter and the removal of the tents outside the Social Hall, we no longer have an outdoor space for gathering to eat. We will return to serving beverages once we can be inside unmasked safely.
