Welcome Back, SGD! Registration is Still OPEN

What a great start to SGD on September 19! We had nearly 90 children and youth attend our first day of in-person programming. Seeing our community coming back together was so gratifying!

It's not too late to enroll. Classes will be held outdoors at least through the end of October, led by teams of committed and enthusiastic volunteer teachers and assistants. In the event of rain, classes will take place under the social hall tent. Class times are approximately 11:30am - 12:45pm.

Please bring your children and youth to the Fahs Chapel when you arrive at the building (go straight through the double doors after you enter the building.) Masks are required at all times. Please bring water bottles. In addition, we recommend you prepare for outdoor hazards including sunburns, bug bites and stings, and inclement weather.

One of the cornerstones of our Spiritual Growth and



Development Program is Our Whole Lives (O.W.L.), a sexuality education program for youth that models and teaches caring, compassion, respect, and justice. It is an holistic program that moves beyond the intellect to address the attitudes, values, and feelings that youth have about themselves and the world. We usually offer O.W.L. to 8th graders as a full academic year course; this year we are hoping to put together a teaching team by January. Because teaching O.W.L. requires participation in a comprehensive training (and those trainings are currently scarce due to covid), we need to recruit from our existing pool of trained O.W.L. teachers. With two teachers already committed, that means we only need two more. Please consider helping us bring back this popular and dynamic program!

Sunday, October 17, 1:00pm


Restorative Justice of UUAA and UUCivs invite you to a presentation and discussion with
