Are You a Trained Middle School OWL Facilitator? We Need You!

One of the cornerstones of our Spiritual Growth and Development Program is" Our Whole Lives" (OWL), a sexuality education

program for youth that models and teaches caring, compassion, respect, and justice. It is a holistic program that moves beyond the intellect to address the attitudes, values, and feelings that youth have about themselves and the world.

We usually offer OWL to 8th graders as a full academic-year course; this year we are hoping to put together a teaching team by January. Because teaching O.W.L. requires participation in a comprehensive training (and those trainings are currently scarce due to Covid-19), we need to recruit from our existing pool of trained O.W.L. teachers. With two teachers already committed, that means we need just two more. Please consider helping us bring back this popular and dynamic program!

Decline to Sign!



Michigan's 2020 election was deemed safe and secure by <u>Secretary of State</u> Jocelyn Benson and a <u>State</u> <u>Senate Oversight Committee</u>, but a new petition drive seeks to enact changes that would negatively affect voting accessibility and support. A Republicanbacked group, Secure MI Vote, needs to gather 340,000 signatures in 180 days.

The Michigan legislature will then likely adopt the initiative rather than let it appear on a ballot where voters would decide. Tell your friends and family not to sign! <u>Here's a Bridge Magazine summary of the proposed</u> <u>changes</u>.

From Restorative Justice to Leadership and a Second Chance


Sunday, October 17, 1:00pm
