

#### Green Corner: The Plastics Problem

The plastics industry promotes the idea that plastic can be recycled, putting the responsibility on consumers to do so. In reality, the market for recycled plastics is small.

In 2018, roughly 8.7% of plastics were recycled, 15.8% were incinerated, and 75.5% ended up in landfills or trashed in nature. The Great Pacific Garbage Patch (floating plastic) is now twice the size of Texas.

**Action:** Switch to products with better packaging, such as shampoo bars in cardboard boxes, and then tell companies why you have switched.
