

COVID-19 update: With the stay at home order lifting, Alpha House staff are helping us adjust to the new normal. Once inperson volunteer shifts are added, we will be expected to wear masks inside and be temperature checked when we arrive. Hand Sanitizer is available and all surfaces are being disinfected multiple times each day. As the host week draws near, our committee will be in touch with the staff to get any last-minute updates for our volunteers. Food donors: You can drive up outside and call 734-822-0220 for Alpha House staff to come out and receive your dish. You can ask them to put the cart outside for contactless drop-off. The cart is disinfected multiple times each day.






Zoe's bio:

ShopWithScrip The Scrip Program is <u>changing</u>. Names used for ScripNow, ReloadNow, and PrestoPay will be replaced with simpler descriptions: eGift cards, reloading gift cards instantly or overnight, and paying online with a bank account or credit card.

Many of the 750+ retailers offer instant eGift cards for immediate purchase that can be used personally or sent as gifts by email. It will now be even easier to differentiate online between instant reloads and overnight reloads. A <u>reload</u> <u>products list</u> shows the difference.
