The Five Jagged Rocks of Unitarian Universalism

What do UUs really believe? We'll explore one of Unitarian Universalism's lesser-known pieces

of theology: The "Five Jagged Rocks." Created by Revs. Nancy Bowen and Mike Morran, this course offers a deeper insight into the existential questions of religion. Using an adaptation of the ancient practice of Lectio Divina, we'll gain a greater understanding of each of the "Jagged Rocks" and how they relate to our own lives.

This one-session adult SGD class will be offered on three dates:

UUAA currently has a mighty, but very lean staff team that is exceptionally dedicated and hardworking. Our limited staffing dollars need to be allocated as effectively as possible. This situation invites ongoing reflection on whether we have the right professional


positions and whether we are playing to the strengths of the people we have on staff (i.e., do we have the right person in the right job?). To that end, a staff reorganization that fits our current situation has been created and will go into effect starting in July and August.

While our direct communications were infrequent, knowing there was a person I could reach out to, and who could reach out to me, during Quarantine was comforting. Especially since the family was new to UUAA, it felt good to connect them to Pastoral Care so they would feel a part of our beloved community.

joy to be in community that steps up for each other, we are truly beloved.
