

FROM UUAA'S COVID ADVISORY TEAM: UPDATE TO COVID 'GENERAL NOTIFICATION' PROCEDURES

The UUAA COVID Advisory Team met this week and has decided to move to a once-a-week Dashboard system for General Notifications of COVID cases within our community. This Dashboard will be included in UUAA's weekly e-news, and will indicate the number of positive COVID reports within our community over the course of the preceding week, including "0" cases, if there are none.

UUAA will continue to act immediately on any Close Contact Notifications that may be needed, notifying any potentially exposed close contacts right away. This change impacts only how UUAA will be handling General Notifications, for those who are not close contacts, and mirrors recent changes in COVID General Notification procedures by local institutions such as the Ann Arbor Public Schools.

record of what we did this time. You can view the Annual Report page on the website **2021-22 Annual Meeting and Report**, but so far it is mostly dead links. If one of those dead links is your activity, please submit a report using the following criteria:

- Aim for a word count of 300 words; submissions significantly beyond this will be returned for further editing. When appropriate, use bulleted lists to encourage others to read what you've shared. UUAA staff will not edit.
- Basic elements to include:
 - The recognized team's name
 - The author(s) of the team's report
 - A brief description of the team or ministry
 - Highlights from May 1, 2021 through April 30, 2022
- Focus on major themes or a few key accomplishments. Your report need not include every detail just enough to give others the flavor of your group's ministry and, if applicable, a brief description of anything your group has done related to COVID-19



- Additional elements you may want to include:
 - Names of active participants in the ministry
 - A description of how UUAA core values were met by the team
 - Future ideas, plans, and goals to support the Vision 20/50 process


